Former Buchanan resident publishes book

Two local dogs and their adoptive parents (Buchanan and Stevensville) are included in the book, along with five forther Michiana residents, including Chalpan.

"This is a real labor of love for me," says Chalpan. "As Titan gets older, it became more and more important for me to write down his stories, and I thought it would be great to share others' stories of how they were rescued by their dogs and the whole adoption experience."

Chalpan is the daughter of Roma Holmes and Don Holmes of Buchanan, and sister of Bonnie (Holmes) Chadderdon of Niles. She has been volunteering with local shelters and dog-related groups for more than a year now. and has supported the shelter from which Titan was rescued since they adopted him. Titan was rescued by the Gwinnett Humane Society, near Atlanta, Ga., from a no-kill shelter on his "kill day" at an animal control facility in north Atlanta. The Chalpans are still in touch with the volunteer who rescued him that day, and in fact, she wrote the foreword for the book.

"We are so grateful for Titan's rescuer and thankful for all of the people who work tirelessly to save these wonderful dogs," said Chalpan. "The unconditional love and pure joy a dog can bring to you and your family is not to be missed, and I am blessed to have Titan in my life."
